4 Reasons a Christian College Might Be Right for You

By the time students start visiting campuses, they're usually thinking about majors, dorm rooms and whether the food is edible. Those are fair questions. But at a Christian college, the conversation tends to go deeper. You're not just asking, "What will I study?" You're asking, "Who am I becoming?"

As organizers of the Midwest Christian College Expo, we've works with students exploring Christian higher education for 38 years. Amazingly, some have returned years with their own high schoolers. It gives me goosebumps. In these past decades I've noticed four themes that come up again and again. They aren't marketing slogans. They're lived realities on campuses where faith and learning share the same air. Realities that the colleges in this guide share.

1. Faith and Learning Belong Together

At a Christian college, faith isn't tucked away in a chapel service once a week. It's woven



into the classroom.

A biology professor may open a lecture with prayer. A business ethics discussion might reference Micah 6:8 — "What does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Literature classes wrestle honestly with doubt and suffering. Psychology courses explore both clinical research and the biblical view of the human person.

That doesn't mean every class is a Bible study. It means professors believe truth is unified — that the God who created the world is also the author of Scripture. Students don't have to compartmentalize their faith from their academics. They're invited to ask hard questions. Sometimes uncomfortable ones.

And that integration forms a habit of mind. You learn to see your future profession not just as

a paycheck, but as a calling.

2. A Community That Knows Your Name

Large universities can be energizing. But they can also be lonely. Christian colleges tend to be smaller, more relational, and intentionally so.

Hebrews 10:24-25 urges believers to "consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds... not giving up meeting together." On a Christian campus, that happens in dorm hallways, over late-night coffee, in small groups and chapel services.

Faculty often serve as mentors, not just instructors. They pray with students. They ask about your family. They notice when you've had a hard week. It's not perfect — no community is — but there's a shared language of grace and accountability.

Students tell me years later that what shaped them most wasn't a particular class, but the friendships formed during four

Christian Colleges Aren't Perfect - But They're Exactly What This Moment Requires



Choosing a college has never felt more complicated.

Tuition is high. Headlines about campus unrest are common. Students report record levels of anxiety. Parents wonder whether universities still share the values they're paying to reinforce.

So when families consider a Christian university, the question isn't sentimental.

It's practical.

Is this the right preparation for real life?

Let's weigh that honestly.

The Cost Conversation (Start Here)

Private Christian universities often carry price tags comparable to other private institutions. That deserves serious scrutiny.

But sticker price and net cost are rarely the same. Many Christian universities offer substantial institutional aid, church-matching scholarships, merit awards and alumni-supported grants. Four-year graduation rates matter, too; finishing on time changes the financial equation in ways families sometimes overlook.

Then there's return on investment. Employers consistently cite qualities like integrity, collaboration and resilience as highly desirable. Christian universities tend to build mentoring structures and leadership development directly into the

FAFSA 2026-27 Brings Stability, Subtle Rule Changes That Could Affect Aid

After several turbulent cycles marked by delays and technical glitches, the 2026-27 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) has arrived with something families have been craving: stability.

The U.S. Department of Education updated the 50-year-old system and returned to a more predictable rollout this year, using a beta-testing period before the form became widely available. The goal was simple - find the bugs early and avoid the chaos that frustrated students and financial aid offices in the past.

For most families, the form looks familiar. But beneath the surface, several changes could affect eligibility, particularly for need-based aid such as the Pell Grant.

Here's what students and parents should know.

Key Changes to the 2026-27 FAFSA

While the structure of the FAFSA remains streamlined under the Student Aid Index (SAI) system introduced previously, several adjustments matter:

■ Earlier, phased release. A

national beta test preceded the full opening of the form, reducing technical slow-downs and processing backlogs.

■ Faster account verification. New StudentAid.gov accounts can now be verified almost immediately through Social Security Administration matching, eliminating the multi-day wait some families experienced before.

■ Simplified contributor process. Students need only a contributor's email address to invite a parent or other required contributor to complete their portion.

■ Asset calculation updates. Beginning with 2026-27:

- A family-owned business with 100 or fewer full-time (or equivalent) employees is excluded from asset calculations.

- A farm on which the family resides is excluded.

- Certain family-owned com-

mercial fishing businesses are excluded.

For families who own small businesses or farms, this change may significantly lower their reported assets - and potentially increase aid eligibility.

Pell Grant Adjustments

Pell Grant eligibility also includes two noteworthy shifts:

- Foreign earned income exclusion counts differently. For families claiming the foreign earned income exclusion, that

excluded income is added back when determining Pell eligibility.

■ New SAI eligibility threshold. Students with a Student Aid Index equal to or greater than twice the maximum Pell Grant are ineligible for Pell funding (with limited exceptions). For 2026-27, that threshold is \$14,790.

For students on the margin of eligibility, these changes could make the difference between receiving a grant or not.







The Contributor Factor Still Matters

Even with a simplified form, the FAFSA cannot be fully processed until all required contributors complete their sections and provide consent for federal tax information to be accessed. Missing signatures or delayed parent responses remain one of the most common reasons applications stall.

Financial aid officers continue to advise families to:

- Create accounts early.
 - Confirm contributor emails carefully.
 - Monitor their FAFSA Submission Summary after filing.
 - Correct errors quickly.
- Looking Ahead: 2027-28 Improvements
- The Department of Education has already begun development of the 2027-28 FAFSA and has previewed several planned



improvements:

- A faster renewal process with pre-populated data for returning students.
- A more streamlined experience for parents with multiple children applying.
- A redesigned contributor invitation system.
- An "earnings indicator" tool showing whether graduates at certain institutions earn less than a typical high school graduate.

The aim is continued simplification - though families who experienced recent disruptions may take a "wait and see" approach.

Financial aid isn't just a form; it's often the hinge on which a college decision swings. And after several unpredictable years, the 2026/27 FAFSA may not be perfect—but, for many families it feels at least a little less daunting.

intense, formative years. Iron sharpens iron (Proverbs 27:17), and living in a Christ-centered community accelerates that sharpening.

3. Space to Clarify Your Calling

College is a season of discernment. At a Christian institution, that discernment is framed theologically.

Ephesians 2:10 reminds us, "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." That verse shows up in career centers and chapel talks for a reason.

Students are encouraged to ask not only, "What am I good at?" but "Where is God leading?"

Internships, mission trips, service projects and faculty mentoring all contribute to that process. A nursing major might see her work as ministry to the vulnerable. An engineering student may talk about stewarding creation. An aspiring journalist may feel called to pursue truth with integrity.

You begin to see your gifts as



entrusted to you for a purpose bigger than yourself. That reframing can change everything.

4. Formation of Character, Not Just a Résumé

Employers consistently say they're looking for integrity, resilience and the ability to work

well with others. Christian colleges intentionally cultivate those qualities.

Galatians 5:22-23 describes the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. These aren't abstract virtues on a wall. They're discussed in leadership courses, modeled by staff and expected in student conduct.

Mistakes still happen. Students fail tests. They argue. They make poor choices. But the response often includes restoration, reflection and growth rather than simple punishment.

When you graduate, you leave with more than a diploma. You carry habits of prayer, a deeper understanding of Scripture and a clearer sense of who you are in Christ.

A Christian college isn't the right choice for everyone. But for students who want their intellectual growth and spiritual life to move in the same direction, it can be a powerful place. Four years go quickly. The formation that happens there lasts much longer.

undergraduate experience. That may not show up in a ranking formula - but it shows up in interviews, recommendations and long-term career mobility.

The question isn't simply, "What does it cost?"

It's, "What am I getting for that investment?"

Not All Christian Campuses Are Small

There's a persistent stereotype that Christian colleges are tiny, insular enclaves.

Some are intimate by design. Others are large, nationally recognized universities with expansive campuses, Division I athletics, research initiatives and enrollments in the thousands - sometimes tens of thousands when graduate and online programs are included.

Size alone doesn't determine community.

What differentiates many Christian universities - large or small - is intentional culture. Faculty mentoring systems. Cohort-based academic programs. Residence life structured around shared values. Leadership opportunities tied to service and formation.

Even on a large campus, the ethos often encourages students not to disappear into the crowd.

Students are known - not just processed.

Intellectual Seriousness Without Fragmentation

Another concern families raise is academic rigor. Will students be competitive for graduate school? Medical school? Law? Engineering firms?

Accredited Christian universities meet the same academic standards as their secular peers. Many faculty hold terminal degrees from major research institutions. Labs, internships, undergraduate research opportunities and global study programs are common.

The distinction is philosophical, not academic.

Instead of treating worldview questions as irrelevant or purely private, Christian universities allow those questions to remain visible. Students explore economics, biology, literature or data science while also asking larger questions about meaning, ethics and human dignity. It's not that other universities don't care about those things - many absolutely do. But here, the conversation isn't sidelined or treated as extracurricular.

In a higher education landscape that can feel fragmented - where career training and moral reflection rarely intersect - that



integration becomes a strength.

Stability in a Volatile Era

Higher education is under demographic pressure nationwide. Some institutions are closing. Others are restructuring at an alarming pace.

Yet many Christian universities have demonstrated resilience in recent years.

Clear identity tends to foster loyalty - among alumni, donors and prospective families. Schools that articulate who they are and what they believe often find students who are actively seeking that clarity.

Parents notice stability. Students do too.

In uncertain times, coherence matters. Maybe more than we realized a decade ago.

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Community in a Large World

Large public universities offer breadth and scale. They can also feel anonymous.

Christian universities - even the larger ones - often build smaller communities within the larger institution: living-learning programs, ministry teams, academic cohorts, faculty advising groups.

The spirit of the campus makes a difference. Shared values create common ground. Conversations about purpose, service and leadership aren't peripheral - they're normal.

That doesn't eliminate disagreement. It doesn't prevent mistakes. But it does create an environment where moral and intellectual development move in the same direction. And that alignment, while imperfect, can steady students during years that are anything but simple.

Prestige vs. Trajectory

Rankings are one metric. Trajectory is another.

Where do graduates land? How prepared are they? Do they know what they believe - and why? Can they articulate their values in a professional setting without apology or aggression?

Christian universities increasingly produce graduates in medicine, law, criminal justice, technology, business, education and nonprofit leadership. Their alum-

ni networks are often mission-driven and relationally strong, creating opportunities that extend beyond campus walls.

Prestige opens doors. So does preparation.

When Everything Is Balanced

No institution is flawless. Christian universities face financial pressures, cultural challenges and internal debates just like any other school. There are tradeoffs. There always are.

But when families step back and weigh the full equation - cost, academic preparation, worldview coherence, leadership development, institutional stability and long-term character formation - Christian higher education offers a distinctive value proposition.

Not retreat from the world. Preparation for it.

In a moment when higher education feels uncertain to many families, Christian universities are not merely alternatives. For some students, they may be precisely what this cultural moment requires: places where intellect and conviction, ambition and integrity, preparation and purpose grow together - not in tension, but in alignment.

Choosing a college is never simple. But clarity helps.

And clarity is something Christian universities are uniquely positioned to provide.
